



MANIFESTO FOR HUMANITY AND HEALTH PROTECTION



Preamble

Aware of the threats weighing on human dignity and freedom today—whether from transhumanist ideologies, artificially induced health crises, climate change, or technocratic global governance—we, representatives of the World Academy of Biomedical Sciences and Technologies, the European Coalition, Resistance and Freedom, and the United Humans Movement, solemnly declare the primacy of human beings and the biosphere over all economic, financial, or technological considerations.

In the face of attempts at the complete commodification of life, population control, and the reduction of "useless eaters," we affirm the uniqueness, singularity, and inalienable value of every human person.

We also affirm the importance of preserving human fertility, supporting ethical medically assisted procreation, and rejecting all forms of genetic manipulation or selection.

I. Fundamental Principles

1. Uniqueness of the human species:

Humans are not a commodity nor an object of unlimited experimentation.

2. Humanist and ethical values:

Science and technology must remain at the service of human beings and the common good.

3. Absolute respect for human rights:

The Universal Charter must prevail over any restrictive or delegated agenda.

4. Protection of biodiversity and human diversity:

The biological wealth of the planet and the plurality of human cultures are inseparable.

5. Freedom of research and ethics of science:

A new scientific humanism must govern all innovation.

6. Preservation of human fertility and reproduction :

Support for ethical medically assisted procreation and rejection of genetic selection, manipulation, or optimization.

II. Our Commitments

1. Promote ethical scientific governance based on transparency, accountability, and citizen participation.

2. Defend confidentiality and the protection of personal data against the excesses of global digitalization.

3. Guarantee open, equitable, and accessible healthcare for all, independent of private financial interests.

4. Oppose all forms of coercive population control, genetic manipulation, or eugenic selection.

5. Strengthen a humanist scientific diplomacy that places people and the planet at the heart of global decisions.

6. Preserve peace, by trying to create a culture of peace, by refusing the instrumentalization of war or fear as a means of governance.

III. Call to Action

- **To citizens:** inform yourself, raise awareness, and mobilize for your fundamental rights.

- **To governments:** reaffirm the sovereignty of peoples over their health, food, and natural resources.

- **To scientists and researchers:** commit to responsible, open research free from ideological or financial pressure.

- **To international organizations:** respect your original mandate and place human rights before any public-private partnership.

- **To businesses:** innovate conscientiously and place ethics before profit.

IV. Immediate Program

1. Organization of two international roundtables:

- * **Ethics of science and freedom of research:** towards a new humanism.

- * **Digital transformation and AI in global health:** confidentiality, data protection, and Open Health.

2. **Launch of a permanent WABT think tank** to monitor and analyze transhumanist trends and propose humanist alternatives.

3. **Development of a Global Open Health Charter** guaranteeing equitable access to care and health data sovereignty.

4. **Creation of an independent Observatory of Scientific Diplomacy** to assess the compliance of international policies with humanist principles.

We call on all women and men of good will to join this "Manifesto for Humanity and Health Protection," to sign it, and to disseminate it widely. Together, let us build a future where science, technology, and progress serve the life, freedom, and dignity of every human being.
